#### Kenneth L. Mattox, MD, FACS

Dr. Mattox is a Distinguished Service Professor in the Michael E. DeBakey Department of Surgery and Chief of Staff and Chief of Surgery at Ben Taub General Hospital. He assisted in the development of the internationally renowned Ben Taub General Hospital Emergency Center and equally respected Trauma Center. His reputation as an innovator in trauma care is world-renowned. He has made original and significant contributions in trauma resuscitation, trauma systems, thoracic trauma, vascular injury, autotransfusion, complex abdominal trauma and multi-system trauma. His textbook, "Trauma", is an international best seller. He co-authored "Top Knife", a practical guide to trauma care, translated into ten foreign languages. He frequently receives emails from physicians in war zones who refer to this "little book" as their Bible in the OR. Doctor Mattox is equally adept in the emergency department, operating room, intensive care unit, conference room, courtroom and political arena.
